

## Common sore throat vs. strep:

Strep often produces white patches, as well as red, swollen tonsils. Common sore throat is usually red and irritated from coughing and post nasal drip. Strep often does not accompany other cold symptoms, such as,



nasal congestion and cough. Colds sometimes cause a fever, but it's generally low grade. A sore throat with a fever over 101 raises the likelihood of strep (although it can be present with little or no fever). Strep throat may cause the lymph nodes in the neck to be swollen. These are responsible for trapping and destroying germs. When part of the body is infected, the nearest lymph nodes tend to swell as they carry out their job. The pain of a strep throat tends to be more severe and persistent that it may be hard to swallow. In some cases, strep may cause nausea, a lack of appetite, or pain in the head or abdomen. A rash may appear starting on the neck and chest. This may be a complication of strep, known as scarlet fever.

Strep is a bacterial infection and can be treated with antibiotics. The common cold sore throat is caused by a
